A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to define terms; to
2 appropriate funds for capital construction and property
3 acquisition as prescribed; to state intent; to require
4 program statements and a request for funding; to provide
5 an operative date; and to declare an emergency.

6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.

2 For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill
3 passed by the One Hundred Third Legislature, First or Second Session,
4 which appropriates funds, FY2012-13 means the period July 1, 2012,
5 through June 30, 2013, FY2013-14 means the period July 1, 2013,
6 through June 30, 2014, FY2014-15 means the period July 1, 2014,
7 through June 30, 2015, FY2015-16 means the period July 1, 2015,
8 through June 30, 2016, and FY2016-17 means the period July 1, 2016,
9 through June 30, 2017.

10 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.

11 There are hereby appropriated, for FY2013-14 and
12 FY2014-15, the sums set forth in this act to each agency for each
13 program from the respective funds for capital construction projects,
14 land acquisition, lease-purchase arrangements, and major equipment
15 acquisition, except as otherwise appropriated.

16 Sec. 3. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2013-14 to
17 FY2014-15.

18 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this act,
19 there are hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation balances
20 existing on June 30, 2014, for FY2014-15 to the respective agencies,
21 programs, and funds listed in this act, except as otherwise provided
22 in this act.

23 Sec. 4. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS.

24 The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting
25 System Manual, and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk of

1 the Legislature are hereby adopted by the Legislature as the
2 definitions for this act.

3 Sec. 5. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS.

4 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw
5 warrants upon the proper fund in the state treasury for an amount not
6 to exceed the appropriations set forth in this act upon presentation
7 of proper documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay the warrants
8 out of the appropriate funds.

9 Sec. 6. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
10 appropriations for capital facilities follow an orderly and
11 reasonable process based upon defined and documented need and an
12 analysis of the utilization of existing facilities.

13 The biennial appropriations contained in this act
14 covering FY2013-14 and FY2014-15, which have been designated for
15 planning, require from the agency a complete program statement
16 prepared in accordance with the Procedural Manual for Capital
17 Construction as approved by the state building division of the
18 Department of Administrative Services. Projects directly related to
19 program continuation such as fire and life safety, maintenance,
20 utility improvements, handicapped access, and master planning require
21 a statement of needs prepared in accordance with the manual. An
22 appropriation for drawings and construction may be recommended only
23 after submission of an acceptable program statement or statement of
24 needs on or before September 15 to the state building division, the
25 budget division of the Department of Administrative Services, and the

1 Legislative Fiscal Analyst.

2 Program statements that have been submitted prior to
 3 FY2013-14 shall be updated if necessary and resubmitted during the
 4 period July 1, 2013, to September 1, 2013. Program statements that
 5 have been submitted prior to FY2014-15 shall be updated if necessary
 6 and resubmitted during the period July 1, 2014, to September 1, 2014,
 7 by agency priority. Such priority shall be subject to final
 8 modification by the governing authority of each agency on or before
 9 September 15, 2014.

10 Sec. 7. It is the intent of the Legislature that agencies
 11 should construct or renovate facilities in such a manner as to
 12 provide the greatest cost-effective energy savings possible. Design
 13 criteria emphasizing efficiency, functionality, and energy
 14 conservation shall be reflected in program statements, schematic
 15 design documents, design development documents, and construction
 16 documents. The state building division of the Department of
 17 Administrative Services and the State Energy Office shall provide
 18 technical assistance to the state agencies, upon request, to assist
 19 them in providing for energy-efficient new or renovated facilities.

14 The Department of Health and Human Services is hereby
 15 authorized to acquire land to serve as the site for a new veterans'
 16 home to be located in central Nebraska and to construct the new home
 17 with the appropriation to this program. The total cost of this
 18 project from the Nebraska Capital Construction Fund and federal
 19 funding sources shall not exceed \$121,020,313.

20 There is included in the appropriation to this program
 21 for FY2013-14 \$47,015,459 from the Nebraska Capital Construction Fund
 22 and an estimated \$74,004,854 federal funds to initiate and complete
 23 the project.

24 The Nebraska Capital Construction Funds appropriated in

1 this section may be used as matching funds for available federal or
 2 other funds. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit
 3 use of any private, local, or internally reallocated funds as a match
 4 for any available federal or other funds.

5 It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department
 6 of Health and Human Services shall provide a report electronically to
 7 the Legislature outlining the process and criteria used to select a
 8 site for the new veterans' home. The report shall include, but not be
 9 limited to: Identification of the communities submitting offers to be
 10 a site for the new facility; written responses of interested
 11 communities to questions posed by the site selection committee; the
 12 process used by the selection committee to evaluate offers; the
 13 criteria used by the site selection committee to make a
 14 recommendation to the Director of Veterans' Homes; and the final site
 15 selected. The report shall be provided to the Legislature within
 16 three weeks after site selection. It is the intent of the Legislature
 17 that the site shall not be selected prior to June 5, 2013.

1 such donor or, if none is designated by such donor, by the Governor.

2 Acceptance of a gift, bequest, or devise shall be subject
3 to approval by the expending agency and the following restrictions:

4 (1) No matching of state funds shall be required as a
5 condition of acceptance;

6 (2) Any gift or bequest of personal property in excess of
7 \$10,000 shall be approved by the Governor before acceptance;

8 (3) Any gift or devise of real property in excess of
9 \$10,000 shall be approved by the Governor and the Legislature before
10 acceptance pursuant to sections 81-176 and 81-1108.33; and

11 (4) Sections 81-176 and 81-1108.33 shall govern the
12 acquisition of real property and structures with the proceeds of a
13 gift, bequest, or devise.

14 For purposes of this section, gifts, bequests, and
15 devises shall include, but not be limited to, donations, gifts,
16 bequests, devises, and grants from individuals, organizations,
17 corporations, and similar entities and from nonfederal governmental
18 agencies.

19 At the discretion of the budget administrator of the
20 budget division of the Department of Administrative Services and the
21 Accounting Administrator of the Department of Administrative
22 Services, expenditures of funds from any gift, bequest, or devise may
23 be expended through any existing or administratively created cash
24 fund account, revolving fund account, or trust fund account, in which
25 case the actual amount of the gift, bequest, or devise is hereby

1 appropriated to the expending agency, for the purpose or purposes
2 designated by the donor, in addition to the amounts appropriated in
3 this act. If no such cash fund account, revolving fund account, or
4 trust fund account exists, the Accounting Administrator may create
5 such fund account as is necessary to properly and separately account
6 for the gift, bequest, or devise, in which case the actual amount of
7 the gift, bequest, or devise is hereby appropriated to the expending
8 agency, for the purpose or purposes designated by the donor, in
9 addition to the amounts appropriated in this act.

10 This section shall not apply to the University of
11 Nebraska.

12 Sec. 54. The One Hundred Third Legislature acknowledges
13 that Article III, section 22, of the Constitution of Nebraska
14 provides that each Legislature shall make appropriations for the
15 expenses of the government. Consistent with this provision, any
16 appropriations enacted by prior Legislatures for fiscal years
17 beginning after June 30, 2013, are null and void unless specifically
18 reaffirmed by this Legislature.

19 Sec. 55. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2013.

20 Sec. 56. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
21 when passed and approved according to law.
